#### Be Persistent – See Obstacles as Opportunities


Why is it that some people make it, and others don't? Read 2 Cor. 4:8-18.

Paul calls us to be four things:

- I. Be resilient get back up when you are knocked down (8-9).
- a. Paul was resilient.
  - i. Threaten him in Jerusalem; reappears in Antioch.
  - ii. Stone him and leave him for dead outside Lystra.
  - iii. Throw him in prison in Philippi, converts the jailer.
  - iv. Drag him into a courtroom in Caesarea.
  - v. Shipwreck him and leave him stranded.
  - vi. Throw him into a Roman jail.
  - vii. He got back up when he was knocked down.
- b. It is imperative that Christians have the same spirit of persistence (Proverbs 24:16).
  - i. We are going to get knocked down.
  - ii. We may stumble and even fall in our Christian life.
  - iii. Christians must turn obstacles into opportunities.
- II. Be radical persistent Christians love the Lord more than life itself (10-12).
  - a. The apostle Paul considered himself expendable so that others could come to know Christ.
    - i. Paul was devoted to spreading Christ's message.
    - ii. That is why he persevered and never quit.
    - iii. He loves the Lord and his cause more than life itself.
  - b. Does Jesus matter more to you than life itself?
    - i. Do you love the Lord more than romantic relationships, or the comfort of the U.S.?
    - ii. Is Christ really an all-consuming passion?
    - iii. If we love the Lord, then we don't lose heart.
- III. Be resolved believe what you say you believe (13-14).
  - a. Paul believed certain things were a fact.
    - i. He believed that Jesus died an atoning death.
    - ii. Paul believed that his life had an eternal purpose.
  - b. Christians need to be people who know what they believe.
  - c. Christianity begins with facts to be believed.
    - i. Then there is faith to be expressed.
    - ii. Followed by feelings to be experienced.

IV. Be focused –Christians must keep their eye on the goal

- a. Paul stayed focused on the eternal goal.
  - i. Our goal is to go to heaven.
  - ii. The adversary will do everything to distract us.

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
